Welcome to the beautiful Country of Israel!

You will be greeted by one of our representatives upon your arrival in Tel Aviv. Depending on the time, you will have a short tour around Tel Aviv before checking in to your hotal

Tel Aviv, a city on Israel's Mediterranean coast, is marked by stark 1930s Bauhaus buildings, thousands of which are clustered in the White City architectural area. Museums include Beit Hatfutsot, whose multimedia exhibits illustrate the history of Jewish communities worldwide. The Eretz Israel Museum covers the country's archaeology, folklore and crafts, and features an on-site excavation of 12th century B.C. ruins.

## Day 4: TEL AVIV / CAESAREA / HAIFA / AKKO

Relish your breakfast at the hotel, a guide will be there to take you on a private tour to visit Caesarea.

Caesarea is a town on Israel's Mediterranean coast. It's known for Caesarea National Park, which includes a large Roman amphitheater and the historic port. On the site is an archaeological park with pillars and sculptures, and the remains of a hippodrome, with frescoes and stone seating. The ruins of the seafront Promontory Palace include the remains of a mosaic floor.

You will then explore Haifa. It is a northern Israeli port city built in tiers extending from the Mediterranean up the north slope of Mount Carmel.

The city's most iconic sites are the immaculately landscaped terraces of the Bahá'í Gardens and, at their heart, the gold-domed Shrine of the Báb. At the foot of the gardens lies the German Colony, with shops, galleries and restaurants in 19th-century buildings.

Tour around Acre, commonly known as Akko. It is a port city in northwest Israel, on the Mediterranean coast. It's known for its well-preserved old city walls. In a tunnel in the walls is the Treasures in the Walls Ethnographic Museum, depicting daily life from the Ottoman times to the 20th century.

The mosaic-covered Or Torah (Tunisian) Synagogue has 7 torah arks. The 18th-century Al-Jazzar Mosque has marble pillars and underground pools.

Spend the rest of the evening and dinner at Sofia Hotel (or similar)



# Day 5: TIBERIUS / GOLAN HEIGHTS / VALLEY OF TEARS / SAFED

After you relish your hearty breakfast at the hotel, a guide will then take you on a private tour to Galilee.

Galilee is a region located in northern Israel and southern Lebanon. Galilee traditionally refers to the mountainous part, divided into Upper Galilee and Lower Galilee.

You will be exploring Golan Heights or simply the Golan, a region in the Levant, spanning about 1,800 square kilometers. You will enjoy the taste of the wine in the Golan Heights Winery, an Israeli winery located in Katzrin, built on the site of an agricultural village from the Mishnaic period in the Golan Heights. It is Israel's third-largest winery.

The Valley of Tears will be your next journey. It is the name given to an area in the Golan Heights after it became the site of a major battle in the 1973 Yom Kippur War, known as the Valley of Tears Battle is the name given to an area in the Golan Heights after it became the site of a major battle in the 1973 Yom Kippur War, known as the Valley of Tears Battle.

The Lebanon–Syria border is 394 km (245 m) in length and runs from the Mediterranean coast in the north to the tripoint with Israel in the south.

Next, you will see Banias, an ancient site that developed around a spring once associated with the Greek God Pan. It is located at the foot of Mount Hermon, north of the Golan Heights. The spring is the source of the Banias River, one of the main tributaries of the Jordan River.

You will also tour around ?efat, also spelled as Safad, or Safed, city of Upper Galilee, Israel; one of the four holy cities of Judaism.

Zefat achieved renown in the 16th century as the principal center of the Kabalah City, the occult theosophy and interpretation of the Scriptures forming the principal mystical system of Judaism.

Go back to your hotel to have a delightful dinner and overnight stay at Sofia Hotel (or similar)



## Day 7: JORDAN / AMMAN / PETRA

A pleasant Morning! Have your hearty breakfast at the hotel. Today you will be on a private tour to Amman.

Amman, the capital of Jordan, is a modern city with numerous ancient ruins. Atop Jabal al-Qala'a hill, the historic Citadel includes the pillars of the Roman Temple of Hercules and the 8th-century Umayyad Palace complex, known for its grand dome. Built into a different downtown hillside, the Roman Theater is a 6,000-capacity, 2nd-century stone amphitheater offering occasional events.

You will tour around Madaba, an ancient town in Jordan, southwest of the capital Amman. It's known for its 6th-century mosaic map of the Holy Land in the Greek Orthodox Church of St. George.

The Madaba Archaeological Park preserves the mosaic-rich Church of the Virgin Mary and artifacts from the Hellenistic, Roman, Byzantine, and Islamic eras. Northwest, the biblical hill of Mount Nebo overlooks the Jordan Valley and the Dead Sea

Drive to Petra.

Have your dinner and overnight stay at Moon Hotel in Petra (or similar)



#### Day 6: TIBERIUS / SEA OF GALILEE / JORDAN

Good day! Have a delicious breakfast at the hotel. Today, you will be on a private tour to Tiberius which includes a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee.

First, you will see the Tabgha, an area situated on the north-western shore of the Sea of Galilee in Israel. It is traditionally accepted as the place of the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes and the fourth resurrection appearance of Jesus after his Crucifixion.

Then you will visit Capernaum, a fishing village established during the time of the Hasmoneans, located on the northern shore of the Sea of Galilee. Archaeological excavations have revealed two ancient synagogues built one over the other. A house turned into a church by the Byzantines is believed to have been the home of Saint Peter.

The Mount of Beatitudes is a hill in northern Israel, in the Korazim Plateau. It is where Jesus is believed to have delivered the Sermon on the Mount.

You cross over the Jordan River Crossing or Sheikh Hussein Bridge, one of the three international border crossings between Jordan and Israel. It is located between Irbid, Jordan, and Beit She'an, Israel.

You will now transfer to Jordan. If time permits, you will have a chance to visit Jerash.

Jerash is a city in Jordan, north of the capital Amman. Inhabited since the Bronze Age, it's known for the ruins of the walled Greco-Roman settlement of Gerasa just outside the modern city. These include the 2nd-century

Hadrian's Arch, the Corinthian columns of the Temple of Artemis, and the huge Forum's oval colonnade. The Jerash Archaeological Museum displays artifacts excavated from the site.

Drive to Amman for a delightful dinner and overnight stay at Amman Land Mark hotel Ex Radisson SAS (or similar)



## Day 8: PETRA / WADI RUM

Enjoy your delightful breakfast at the hotel.

Today, you will be on a whole day private tour to Petra.

Petra is a famous archaeological site in Jordan's southwestern desert. It was the capital of the Nabatean Kingdom. Accessed via a narrow canyon called Al Siq, it contains tombs and temples carved into pink sandstone cliffs, earning its nickname, the "Rose City."

Perhaps its most famous structure is 45m-high Al Khazneh, a temple with an ornate, Greek-style facade, and known as The Treasury.

Drive to Wadi Rum in the afternoon and enjoy your dinner and overnight stay at Wadi Rum Aicha Luxury Camp (or similar)



## Day 10: WADI RUM / MASADA / JERUSALEM

You will enjoy your hearty breakfast at the hotel.

Today, you will be on a private tour to visit Masada with Cable Car. You will hike in Ein Gedi, an oasis and a nature reserve in Israel, located west of the Dead Sea, near Masada and the Qumran Caves. Ein Gedi was listed in 2016 as one of the most popular nature sites in the country.

And if the weather is good, you can have the chance to dip into the water of the Dead Sea.

The Dead Sea is a Salt Lake bordered by Jordan to the east and Israel and the West Bank to the west. It lies in the Jordan Rift Valley, and its main tributary is the Jordan River. Its surface and shores are 430.5 meters below sea level, Earth's lowest elevation on land.

Then you will visit the incredible Qumran, an archaeological site in the West Bank managed by Israel's Qumran National Park.

Drive to Jerusalem for a delicious dinner and overnight stay at Leonardo Boutique hotel (or similar)





Day 9: WADI RUM / DEAD SEA

Good Morning!

Relish your delightful breakfast at the hotel.

You will cross to Israel in the afternoon through the Arava border.

An Israeli guide will meet you at the border and will assist you to your next destination.

Drive to Dead Sea area for a dinner and overnight stay at Hod Hotel (or similar)

## Day 11: JERUSALEM

After you have your breakfast at the hotel, you will look out at Jerusalem from Mt. of Olives.

You will visit the Church of All Nations, also known as the Church or Basilica of the Agony, is a Roman Catholic church located on the Mount of Olives in East Jerusalem, next to the Garden of Gethsemane. It enshrines a section of bedrock where Jesus is said to have prayed before his arrest. (Mark 14:32–42)

Next, you will see the Broad Wall, an ancient defensive walls in the Old City of Jerusalem's Jewish Quarter. The wall was unearthed in the 1970s by Israeli archaeologist Nahman Avigad and dated to the reign of King Hezekiah.

Mount Zion is a hill in Jerusalem, located just outside the walls of the Old City. The term Mount Zion has been used in the Hebrew Bible first for the City of David and later for the Temple Mount, but its meaning has shifted and it is now used as the name of ancient Jerusalem's Western Hill.

Located on an upper floor of King David's Tomb, the Room of the Last Supper, also called the Cenacle, is considered one of the holiest sites for Christianity in Jerusalem, since according to the tradition, it was the place where the last supper took place.

Church of Saint Peter in Gallicantu is a Roman Catholic church located on the eastern slope of Mount Zion, just outside the Old City of Jerusalem and then the Church of Saint Anne is a French Roman Catholic church and French national domain located at before start of the Via Dolorosa, between the Lions' Gate and of the Second Station of the Cross, in the Muslim Quarter of the Old City of Jerusalem is your next destination.

You will also travel around Via Dolorosa, a processional route in the Old City of Jerusalem, believed to be the path that Jesus walked on the way to his crucifixion. The winding route from the former Antonia Fortress to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre — a distance of about 600 metres — is a celebrated place of Christian pilgrimage.

Exit through the colorful Arab Market.

## Day 12: JERUSALEM

Enjoy your hearty breakfast at the hotel.

You will be on a private tour to Israel Museum, established in 1965 as Israel's foremost cultural institution and one of the world's leading encyclopedic museums.

The Shrine of the Book is a wing of the Israel Museum in the Givat Ram neighborhood of Jerusalem that houses the Dead Sea Scrolls. Drive by the Knesset Israel's Parliament.

Next, the Yad Vashem is Israel's official memorial to the victims of the Holocaust. It is dedicated to preserving the memory of the dead; honoring Jews who fought against their Nazi oppressors and Gentiles who selflessly aided Jews in need; and researching the phenomenon of the Holocaust in particular and genocide in general, with the aim of avoiding such events in the future.

You will also tour around the market of Jerusalem, the Machane Yehuda.

The Machane Yehuda Market or shuk is the largest market in Jerusalem with over 250 vendors selling everything from fruit and vegetables to specialty foods, and clothing to Judaica. Set between Aggripas and Jaffa Streets, with two main aisles and then many further small walkways once inside.

Lastly, you will visit the Ein Kerem, a charming hillside village famed for its centuriesold holy sites. These include the Church of St. John the Baptist, containing a cave said to be the saint's birthplace, and Mary's Spring, where the Virgin Mary is believed to have drunk.

Dotting the village's narrow streets are galleries and shops selling hand-painted tiles and jewelry, plus quaint cafes and stylish Mediterranean restaurants.

All cancellations of confirmed reservations are subject to a \$350 per person administrative fee.
